Dear Patrons and Community members

Greetings from the Montpelier Center for Arts and Education Board and Staff! 2020 has certainly been a challenging year in so many ways. Thank you for your continued support of our events. classes and programs. We are happy to report that the MCAE has come through 2020 in a healthy state financially and has continued to support the community throughout the pandemic.

Through this community support, we were able to raise \$50K to match a \$50K grant from the Mary Morton Parsons Foundation. This year, that money will be used on needed updates and repairs to the MCAE. The updates that you'll see this year include an improved audio visual system in the ballroom, new carpeting and tile in the hallway and preschool, security cameras on the outside of the facility, repointed brick, auto blinds on the upper windows in the ballroom, a repaved parking lot other needed repairs.

As the pandemic reality set in in March, the MCAE immediately went about plans for continuing community support during this uncertain time. Once virtual learning started in the surrounding county schools, the MCAE set up virtual "learning stations" for our community youth who may have internet challenges or whose parents needed assistance with childcare. We also offer an afterschool learning program that assists with any child who needs to bridge the school to home gap with arts and activities.

During the summer, our Music Under the Stars, Farmers Market and Celebration of the Arts were all well supported and safely social distanced, thanks to our "Village Green" capacity. In the fall and winter, we hosted 2 segments of our History series, our first annual Oyster Festival, our annual Grand Illumination and Santa's North Pole. All events were Covid compliant with appropriate social distancing, sanitary practices and food trucks with individual, hot meals available for purchase.

Our preschool classes as well as our art, yoga, guitar, debate, cheer club and dance have continued with limited interruption. The Center is looking forward to the remainder of 2021, including our annual fundraiser, which has been rescheduled for April 17th, 2021. This years' theme is Mardi Gras Masgerade. Please see our website for tickets and sponsorship information.

The center is happy to welcome several new board members; Chris Johnson (Johnson and Johnson Law firm, Rockville, Va.) Dr. Clara Scott, educator and Montpelier native, Dr. Theresa Neiss (Dr. Tre - Montpelier Chiropractic) and Kelly Aderhold - CPA and lifelong western Hanover resident. This year has also brought several staffing changes at The Center. A fulltime Director of Events position has been added, and we welcomed Christi Connors into this position in January. Christi comes to us with much experience in events planning, most recently managing events at the American Civil War Museum. The Program Coordinator responsibilities are now handled by Anton Freeman. Anton joined the center last year as a part time office and afterschool assistant and quickly became an integral part of our team. Kelly Waldrop continues as our Executive Director and has led the center through this year with confidence and a steadfast passion for serving this community that is second to none.

Thank you for your continued support for the Center and for our Western Hanover Community. I look forward to seeing you at our upcoming events.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS



With the incredible support of our patrons and community, we met & exceeded the \$50,000 match granted by the Mary Morton Parsons Foundation for vital building repairs and updates needed to take care of our historic school building!

The Mary Morton Parsons Foundation awarded The Montpelier Center for Arts & Education a \$50,000 challenge 1:1 matching grant to help jumpstart and raise funds to cover pressing capital needs of The Montpelier Center's historical building.

This year, we are thrilled to be able to do the following: replace the lift system for ballroom windows, install auto blind system for upper windows in the ballroom, add a commercial quality screen & projector for the ballroom, replace the tiles and carpet in entrance hallways, kitchen, & preschool, replace the hot water boiler system, repair the parking lot, and point up bricks around the exterior of the building.

With these improvements in place, The Montpelier Center will better able to meet its growing demand for more arts, historical, educational, musical, theater, preschool, and cultural events and programs in its community.





We are looking forward to this year's festival on November 13th.








2020 YEAR REVIEW


What a fun day celebrating everything art! Attendees could try out paint pouring, chalk art, pottery, flower arranging, and more!




