

The Cabell Foundation has awarded The Montpelier Center for Arts & Education a \$100,000 challenge grant on a 1:1 dollar match.

These grant funds will cover the capital needs of the historical building for the next two years, including a new roof, new heating and air conditioning system, rebuild of all four restrooms, a commercial quality audio/public address system, repainting the interior, refurbishing historic exterior doors, and refinishing the hardwood floors. With these improvements in place, The Montpelier Center will be poised to meet its growing demand for more arts, historical, educational, musical, dance, pre-school, and additional cultural events and programs in our neighborhood.

As a private 501(c)3 non-profit organization, The Montpelier Center must raise \$100,000 before June of 2018 to match The Cabell Foundation grant. 
HISTORY RETURNS SERIES

AND Bill and Bob will be the judges for *A Slice of History*, The Montpelier Center's pie baking contest...who could be better qualified? Stay tuned for more information!








ASED ON THE TRUE STORY

Historical novelist and Hanover County resident Connie Lapallo presents a fresh look at the founding of Jamestown for the first time through the eyes of women and children who were there...for transoceanic voyages, hurricanes, starvation. Follow nearly 100 women and children who sailed to Jamestown in 1609. Why so many at one time? Why did they want to come? What was life like on a small ship for several months at a time? Connie's 12th great-grandmother was among the group.

With John Maass as our guide, we'll follow the Marquise de Lafayette and General Anthony 'Mad Dog' Wayne as they skirmish with Cornwallis and Tarleton through Hanover and adjoining counties in 1781 on the way to Yorktown. As an author/historian with the U.S. Army Center of Military History, Dr. Maass accesses original documents of both our Continental Army and the British/Hessian forces. Let John show you where the armies travelled and fought...maybe through your own backyard!



Many hidden treasures reside at the Virginia Historical Society founded in 1831, but too few know what or how to find them. Join Jennifer Huff, Reference Department Coordinator at VHS, to learn the secrets of back in the day. She'll highlight materials related to Hanover County...maybe even about your own family ancestors! And bring your laptop if you like as she'll expertly guide you through the online catalog and website, in addition to the voluminous archives which are not yet digitized. What a resource for us here in Hanover, one of Virginia's 'burned counties'.



A professional actor who loves history brings Patrick Henry here to Montpelier. Enjoy Charles Wissinger's portrayal of Hanover County's favorite son from his birth, through his business ventures, the Parsons' Cause law suit that catapulted him to fame, and climaxing with his famous 'Give me Liberty, or Give me Death" speech at St. John's Church during the Second Virginia Convention in 1775. A special extra treat will be a display of historically accurate costumes tailored by Charles whose prior roles have included film, television, commercials and theater.


View the ever changing beauty of the seasons in this exhibit by Tanya Broderick.



These shots are thanks to the incredibly talented photographer Robert J. Szabo. Thank you Robert for capturing the beauty of The Montpelier Center Village Green! Get to know Robert Szabo below.



Robert J. Szabo has been a photographer for more than 40 years. His love of history first brought him to Virginia from his native state of Ohio. After several years of involvement with living history groups, he leaned on his own past as a commercial and portrait photographer and embraced the history of photography. Robert's artistic vision enables him to peer through his camera and see a window to the past. Whether an historic scene or a modern image, his work evokes romanticism, yet rests on a sense of strength and stamina. The merging of times seems complete. The camera long ago gave the world a dynamic new view of itself, and his camera today gives us a quiet, soft, reflective present.

Robert has exhibited extensively at historic sites across Virginia, Maryland, Pennsylvania, Missouri, Wyoming and California with the National Park Service.
